Contains a great deal of chemical interest, chapters on fermentation, quinine, etc., etc., with references to Lullus, Arnaldus de Villanova, Rupescissa and other authorities. Aignan died in 1709. In 1678 two monks called the "Capucins du Louvre," worked in the Louvre on chemistry; Aignan was one of them. In the first chapter of his book Aignan claims for the clergy the right to study and practise medicine. In another chapter he maintains that each country produces its own means to heal diseases. Two other chapters deal with coffee and tea to be made in France from plants growing in that country. Aignan was assistant to the well-known Abbé Rousseau and a curious story about the relations between the two men will be found in De la Marre's "Observations critiques sur un livre du Sr. Aignan intitulé 'L'ancienne Médecine à la Mode.' Paris, 1702".

One of the most valuable early collections of texts the most important one being that of Geber which served as a basis for Darmstaedter's work (Die Alchemie des Geber, 1922) where six of the woodcuts are reproduced. Darmstaedter points out that this is the first time that Geber is referred to as an Arab and he explains the reason for this (Op. cit. p. 4). The famous Smaragdine Table is found here in print for the first time (Ferguson I, 393) and the work attributed to Roger Bacon is the original text from which the 1597 English edition (The Mirror of Alchemy) was made.

An excessively rare collection ; the first part consists of nine alchemical tracts by various authors a full list of which is given by Ferguson, l.c. The second part is exclusively occupied by the first printing of the famous " Rosarium Philosophorum," with its curious symbolical woodcuts ; the Latin text is interspersed with poems in German. C. G. Jung devoted one of his latest books, " Die Psychologie der Übertragung," Zürich, 1946 (q.v.) to an explanation of the symbolism of the " Rosarium Philosophorum."

A first edition of this work appeared in 1604, but the last seven tracts appear for the first time in this edition. Caillet 161 mentions the book, but confuses the two editions. Only one other copy of the present edition is recorded (Bodleian).

This is the third edition of Wecker's translation, and the first one to contain the seventh book (pp. 278-354). Wecker's letter of dedication is dated : Basileae 20. Iulij 1560. It therefore can not be contained in the first edition which appeared in 1559.
