" Perhaps the author's most important alchemical work, and according to Prof. E. v. Meyer, one of the few genuine works of the many attributed to him." (Zeitlinger.) Byrckmann, the publisher, produced 2 editions of this work in 1566, year of the edition princeps, both having the same title and contents, but printed in a different manner. This is the edition quoted by Ferguson ; the other one has the following collation : 8vo, ff. (4), 231, (8), with diagrams in the text and 2 folding diagrams.

This volume is edited by Michel Toxites, a Strassburg physician, who dedicated his work to three men of Bunzlau (in Silesia) who apparently had been his fellow students.

A very rare critical work on the " Arbor Scientiae," Lull's great scientific encyclopaedia explaining the relationship between ideas. The book contains a good deal of scientific matter, including some on chemistry.

This copy has not got the ten preliminary leaves containing the prefaces by the translator and by the commentator, and the privilege. The 93 Aphorisms at end have been replaced by " Le Chemin du Ciel Chymique." This latter is the text which was published by d'Houry in 1688 as a part of " Lettre d'un Philosophe sur le secret du Grand Oeuvre " (Ferguson II, 39), attributed to Limojon de Saint Didier. The author of the " Chemin " is given as Jaques Tol and the text ends with " A Amsterdam, le jour suivant des Kalendes de Septembre, 1688 " (Ferguson II, 458).
