Joshua Ward (1685-1761) became famous and very rich through his pins, which had an immense reputation at the time. He also made many chemical experiments attempting to manufacture porcelain and saltpetre at his laboratories at Twickenham and at Richmond. A considerable controversial literature was caused by his activities and he left his secrets to Mr. Page who published them in this pamphlet.

A rare work, which was written in opposition to Khunrath and the Rosicrucian Order and contains many arguments against alchemy. At the end of the " Epistre Dedicatoire " is the autograph signature of the author.

This is an entirely mystical and alchemical book ; 6 of die plates are of great alchemical interest. Very rare.

A book of great importance in the history of chemistry and science generally, written in dialogue form. The second of the 11 treatises in the book treats of chemistry in general with a strong attack on the pretensions and obscurities of the goldmakers, the sixth and seventh dialogues contain definitions of saltpetre, borax and other substances, investigations of the effects of manure and fertilizers on the soil, and how by continuous cultivation the ground becomes sterile as it loses its saline contents whilst the eleventh treatise discusses marl and its value for improving the soil. The tenth treatise contains an exposition of Palissy's famous discoveries in the field of enamels and the ceramic arts. The eighth treatise discusses gems and precious stones, investigating their weight and hardness in quite a modern scientific spirit.

Extremely rare. Ferguson acquired his copy, now in the University of Glasgow, after years of search and he has written on the flyleaf : " At last, after long, long waiting and watching."

A very fine copy from the celebrated collection of Baron Roger Portalis with his bookplate.

First Edition of what Sudhoff (No. 89) calls " one of the most important writings of the Paracelsus literature of the time." In addition to a compendium of Paracelsus's works the book contains his book on longevity with a commentary by Jean Gohory (q.v.) who was himself an important and interesting character (see Alexander, " A Further Bibliography of the late John Ferguson," p. 27).

The biography of Paracelsus is one of the earliest and the list of his writings is important.

Ferguson (Bibliographia Paracelsica p. 13) says : " The portrait in this edition is one of the earliest if it be not actually the first of Paracelsus." See Aberle, p. 496.

Mook (p. 51, No. 62) describes the reprint, Basle, 1568, and says that he has been unable to see a copy of the Paris edition.
